SAFETY

Safety remains a priority for the Newton BIA and a number of initiatives are focused on supporting and promoting a safe, liveable, and vibrant Newton Town Centre.

#### **BUSINESS** SAFETY LINK

An integrated business safetu communication program. Sharing safety alerts with businesses and following up with incident reports filed by businesses.

#### **NEWTON SAFETY** UNIT

A collaborative weekly safety initiative for the Newton Town Centre. Meeting with RCMP, CSP, Surrey Crime Prevention, Bylaw, and other community stakeholders to create weekly targets and initiatives to increase communication, effectiveness, and ultimately decrease crime within Newton.

#### **COMMUNITY SAFETY** PATROL

The Newton BIA took over the Community Safety Patrol (CSP) program from the City of Surrey and is maintaining it here in the Newton Town Centre as of Jan 1st, 2016. The CSP will consist of one daily eight hour patrol to address safety priorities and support crime reduction initiatives.

The Newton BIA works closely with the City on a variety of beautification projects. Additionally, the BIA has implemented a number of enhancement initiatives.

#### **TEAM TIDY**

**AREA ENHANCEMENT** 

Clean streets team created by the NBIA sourced through AVIA. Responsible for maintaining cleanliness of the streets within the NBIA boundary.
